






Purpose of the visit

Why Japan?

- Since May 2024, Connah's Quay High School has been partnered with Takamoridai Junior high School, near Nagoya, Aichi Province, Japan through our education partner Global School Alliance

- We chose Japan both for our local links to the Toyota car plant on Deeside but also for its education system which relies on the concept of "the whole child"



Parental contributions

Parents will contribute approximately 25% of the overall cost.

Government funding

Government funding has been applied for which should cover 75% of the overall cost.



Fundraising

Participants will be expected to participate in events such as bag packing. Other funding sources are being investigated

- Costs without funding:
- Itinerary = £1050 + flights = £1200 = Total= £2250
- Funding has been applied for to cover:
- £400 towards the itinerary
- £905 towards the flights
- £315 organisational support fee
- This is specifically to enable disadvantaged learners to participate
- Proposed parental cost = £700
- PROPOSED COST IS APPROXIMATE- depending on the cost of flights, this may increase slightly
- Plan to keep the cost as low as possible:
- Fundraising events e.g. bag packing at local supermarkets; application for local charitable grants, match funding, Christmas bingo in school

Learners who have regularly attended International Club meetings and already linked with Takamoridai JH




Names out of the hat

Your Questions Answered

What vaccinations will my child need to go to Japan? - Answer taken from NHS Scotland website

- •Courses or boosters usually advised: none.
- •Other vaccines to consider: Hepatitis B; Tetanus.
- •Selectively advised vaccines only for those individuals at highest risk: Hepatitis A; Japanese Encephalitis; Tick-borne Encephalitis.
- •No yellow fever vaccination certificate required for this country.

How do I apply for a visa?

Foreign nationals/people who wish to travel to Japan for tourism for a short-term period can apply for a visa online and receive an electronic visa (eVISA) through the JAPAN eVISA system. Non –UK nationals may need to contact their consulate for advice.

When does my child need to have a passport by?

As soon as possible as we will need passport details for flights. Further advice to follow. The visit is oversubscribed, how will my child know if they have secured a place on the visit? Once Mrs Threadgold & Mrs Davies have ensured that all criteria have been met, Mrs Threadgold will contact parents/carers to let them know via email/ phone call.




